

Bulawayo bombing suspects released

Two suspects who appeared before a Bulawayo Magistrate's Court facing terrorism charges have been released as the state has failed to prove its case. A [TimesLIVE](#) report notes that Douglas Musekiwa and John Zulu were accused of being the masterminds behind **'insurgency, banditry, sabotage or terrorism' that claimed two lives and injured 50 last month**. Among those injured in the 24 June attack at a Zanu-PF rally at a stadium in Bulawayo were one of Zimbabwe's Vice-Presidents, Kembo Mohadi, and Environment Minister Oppah Muchunguri. The attack is reported to have been directed at President Emmerson Mnangagwa who left the podium a few seconds before the explosion. The suspects appeared before Bulawayo Magistrate Gladmore Mushowe over the weekend as the 48-hour detention period ran out. The report notes that Mushowe gave the state another 24 hours which expired on Monday last week when they were released.
